# Registration and Race Numbers

#### SATURDAY:

- Registration & collection of your race numbers and timing chip will occur from 9:30am - 10.30am at Eurongilly Community Hall
- The race number and timing chip will remain with you for the duration of the weekend and used for all events.
- Please return items at the end of the last race.

Briefing

- Race briefing will occur on the start line 15mins before the Individual Time Trial, and prior to the Road Race.
- Team allocation for Sunday events will occur prior to racing on Sunday

Spirit of Sport

All athletes and officials are expected to observe the "spirit of sport" requirements when participating in the Games, and adhere to the Academies' Code of Conduct.

Officials
